CPCWHS1001 - Prepare to work safely in the construction industry

COURSE OVERVIEW

White Card is a term used to describe the plastic card issued by a Registered Training Organisation indicating that a person has undertaken general induction training for construction work.

This is a course of training that provides basic knowledge of construction work, the Work Health and Safety (WHS) laws that apply, common hazards likely to be encountered in construction work and how the associated risks can be controlled.

Under WHS legislation, workers on construction sites in Australia must undertake general induction training or 'White Card training' and have evidence of their attendance from the course before they are permitted to commence work on a construction site.

COURSE OUTCOMES

On completion of the course you will be able to:

- Identify health and safety legislative requirements of construction work
- Identify construction hazards and risk control measures
- Identify health and safety communication and reporting processes
- Identify incident and emergency response procedures
- If successful you will receive a Statement of Attainment and plastic White Card with your photograph
